

i enter the shop. from the musty indistinctness of collective memory, i pluck the impossible bodies of warped wools, the glossed wink of enamel buttoning, silks silver-tongued in the phosphor. i fold my body into these faded carapaces, slipping, structuring in places or else sloughing off. selves accumulate in a dull heather down on the floor. we take on the shapeless form-making of a membrane. an intensification. a synchronized swarming.¹

bootlegs of bootlegs circulate. like the curved engraving of spirits on flesh, the bootleg doubles desire differently. when a print's screen is traced, it is said to have a ghost. but what is the psychometry of a cuff? the *Geist* by what measure? we turn the shirt inside out, press print to belly to hear the contours of its devotions: annals of sudorous boy bedrooms (the musked skins of sun-warmed orange pekoe tea); byssinosis; Baixa de Cassanje revolt. hate is economic.² when Heracles dons the shirt of Nessus, he becomes a doubled body. venom limns what it consumes.

the stain, too, is a doubling, as well as a ghost. we recall an image of muslin draped across the sumac brush at a sacred site in Talfit. the cloth is said to absorb the shrine's power, becoming a protective medium between supplicant and spirit.³ in our memory, the cotton blooms crimson, though the image is black and white. in our memory, we want to cover its redness, but its silvered fibres still sip from the sun. today, we sink into the shade of a sleeve's berry coloured splotch. we lick every place where a scratch appears.

the pyre recalls us to formlessness. we refuse to be a body of fear. we let cold tin warm in the hearth of our ear; its sharpness tunes the rhythm of our holding. and in the blackening light, our darned ideologies, singed, soften and, feathered, circulate anew. in leaving, we place a sprig of sumac at a spirit's nose so that the world will stop burning.

¹ *Pantoea agglomerans* is a bacterium that lives on cotton plants and in the bellies of locusts. The guaiacol they produce is a main component of the pheromones that support locusts' cohesion in flight.
